- What: A Hike in Chino Hills State Park
- When: Saturday, January 13, 2018 10 AM - 12 PM (<u>Rain cancels</u>!)
- Where: Chino Hills State Park 4721 Sapphire Road, Chino Hills (See the "Getting There" section for details)
- Why: Meet the State Park and your Assemblyman
- **Fee:** Entrance into the Park is \$5 per vehicle. Park in the lot below the campground.

* These are uneven, narrow dirt trails that are not ADA accessible. Strollers will not work on our planned route either. We are limited to 50 people. Participants should be age 8 or older. This event will start at the parking lot below the campground. During the 2 mile hike you'll see the beautiful and wide expanses of lower Aliso Canyon and trek up to the edge of Bane Ridge. See the grasslands, scattered oaks, and sycamores of the State Park, get to know your Assemblymember, and Hills For Everyone's hopes for the Park too.





Please wear long pants and sturdy close toed shoes. You may also want to bring water, a hat, sunscreen, camera, and/or binoculars.



The park's closest cross streets are Soquel Canyon Road and Elinvar in Chino Hills. From Soquel Canyon turn south on Elinvar. It merges into Sapphire to the left, the park entrance is located on the right at 4721 Sapphire Road. Go up the asphalt road past the park kiosk. Drive three miles to the Rolling M Ranch area. Park in the lot below the campground. **It takes about 20 minutes to drive to our meeting location,** plan accordingly.
