Chino Hills airport to be explained here

A letter has been received from the people who are planning the Chino Hills Airport, confirming that representatives will be at the Community Building at 7:30 tomorrow night (Thursday) to tell the public about their plans and progress. announced, a meeting set up by the Federal Aviation Administration Feb. 3 at the Aviation administration for Feb. 3 at the Valencia High School, 500 North Bradford Avenue, Placentia.

The meeting here was arranged by the Airport committee of the Chamber of

Commerce, and is expecting John Lowman, retired Marine Corps Colonel and Leo Leary, vice president of the Reg Wood Company, Santa Ana, to present information to the public concerning the proposed airport.

It would be located in Telegraph Canyon at 1,400 feet above sea level, about 700 above the elevation of Chino. The developers are anticipating a reply from the FAA in mid-February on traffic that could be handled at the airport, which will have a bearing on the economic fea-

sibility of the development.

Earliest date mentioned for possible opening of the airport is 1976. If the FAA's report on types and numbers of aircraft is favorable, an environmental impact study will be undertaken.

The public is invited to the meeting tomorrow night. Invitations were sent out to public officials and to the Corona Chamber of Commerce, which has taken a negative stand on the Chino Hills jetport.
