Range fires more frequent, severe, study finds

Fires in and around the Chino Hills State Park are becoming larger and more frequent, according to a fire study produced by Hills for Everyone, the non-profit organization that created the State Park.

"Though fires are a natural part of the ecosystem, there is nothing natural about the size and frequency of the fires destroying our wildlands year after year," said Claire Schlotterbeck, executive director of Hills for Everyone. "Too many fires are burning too often in this area.' The report, called "A 100-

year History of Wildfires Near Chino Hills State Park,' tracked perimeters, points of origin, causes, and weather conditions for fires that burned in or around the park between 1914 and 2011.

The park sits at the juncture of four counties: Los Angeles, Orange, Riverside, and San Bernardino. After more than 30 acquisitions since 1981, it encompasses 14,100 acres. The two-year study showed

that more than 100 fires oc-

curred, most of them since 1977. Although the organization spent two years poring over data from fire agencies including the California Department of Forestry and

Fire Protection, the Orange

County Fire Authority, the

Chino Valley Independent

Fire District, newspaper archives, and the California Department of Parks and Recreation, not every fire was documented for study. Few data were produced about how range fires started because historic record-keeping wasn't as complete as it is now, Ms. Schlotterbeck said.

"Our data is incomplete because there are a lot more fires that we just don't know about," she said. "We're not going after a doctorate or seeking peer review, we just wanted to get a handle on what was happening.'

Freeway Complex

She said the Freeway Complex Fire in 2008 prompted the study when 187 homes were destroyed, 131 homes were damaged, 95 percent of the State Park was burned, and 30,000 acres were charred in four counties. The data showed that ar-

eas that have burned repeatedly include the 91 Freeway corridor between Anaheim and Corona, Carbon Canyon in Brea, and the Rim Crest entrance to the park in Yorba Schlotterbeck said Ms.

Santa Ana winds come in from the east and blow west, increasing speed as they funnel down through tight canyons. The increased speed creates ember storms, blowing embers into attics and vents of homes.

The top three causes of range fires in the study area



were arson, power lines, and automobiles.

Factors influencing the increased frequency of fires are roadways, the growing interface between range lands and urban lands and the proliferation of flammable non-native vegetation such as palm trees and arundo.

"If there are lessons to be learned, it seems that jurisdictions should revisit how their communities grow and where the most appropriate place for housing developments should be located," Ms. Schlotterbeck said. An example of good plan-

ning is the Vista Del Verde project in Yorba Linda, where a golf course was built between the range and the houses, and cactus was planted to keep coyotes out as well as provide habitat for the cactus wren, she said. When cities increase the

density of a housing development but do not increase the road capacity on arterials, evacuations during a firestorm are difficult and potentially disastrous, Ms. Schlotterbeck said. Cities and homeowners

associations must maintain defensible space and not allow it to become overgrown, she said. California Parks and Rec-

reation Environmental scientist Alissa Ing stated in the study that Chino Hills State Park is an example of a landscape that has been modified by fire, where the dominant coastal sage scrub and chaparral is changing to highly flammable non-native

annual grasses.

These grasses reproduce and go to seed immediately after a fire, as happened in the State Park after 95 percent of it burned, making it difficult for chaparral to come

Recommendations

Among the expected recommendations such as increasing fire agency presence and patrols during high wind days, others include: "hardening" the edges of the 91 Freeway that abut natural lands with K-rails, incorporating a frequent maintenance program for power lines, requesting that Caltrans improve consistency on fuel clearance along Carbon Canyon Road and spray plants when they are small to make hand crew removal

easier and less expensive, and placing fire agencies that serve Chino Hills, Brea, and Yorba Linda at the bottom of the list for sending mutual aid to others areas on high fire hazard alert since they may

have their own fires to tend. Ms. Schlotterbeck said power lines are the second highest cause of fires. "There needs to be a regular maintenance of power lines and enforcement procedures in place," she said.

Hills for Everyone will take the study "on the road" and present it to city councils and
